Description

The Vinaigrette is modelled in a slender rectangular form, the palely gilded exterior is decorated with engine turning and displaying a cast foliate scroll thumbpiece. The cover with applied gold plaque engraved with a Scottish Lion Rampant Crest with the Motto " Fracta Non Verba - Deeds not Words" above. The Crest and Motto are those as used by the Niblock-Stuart family of Montrose. The cover opens to reveal a finely gilded interior and grille pierced with engraved with pluming foliate scrolls. This piece is very well marked inside.
