Description

The Box has a very unusual slender broad rectangular form, with bombe sides chased with flower heads, scrolls and fruit on a matted ground. The base is decorated with a crisp engine turned panel and the cover displays a very unusual hunting scene with a huntsman in Georgian costume holding a musket, with gun dog in front, which is all contained in a detailed countryside landscape with an engine turned frame. The interior displays fine original gilding and crisp hallmarks. The box is in excellent condition and is of a very good weight. John Tongue, the silversmith, was an exceptional box maker and his quality of design and production was equal to the great Nathaniel Mills.
