A very rare George III 'Pastern Hoof' Caddy Spoon made in Birmingham in 1808 by Cocks & Bettridge.

Short Description

This very rare Caddy Spoon is referred to as the Pastern Hoof because of its resemblance in shape to the pastern of a horse which is between the fetlock and the hoof. The bowl of the spoon has a raised pierced gallery and is engraved with very unusual prick dot designs. The handle is also decorated with foliate designs and an oval cartouche containing a script initial. The Spoon is in excellent condition and is very well marked on the reverse. A similar example is shown on plate 50, fig a, of Caddy Spoons, by Captain John Norie.
