Short Description

The Strainer has a circular bowl with raised rim decorated with cording. This piece has two handles so that it can be placed over the top of a punch bowl, so that the fruit could then be squeezed and strained into the punch. The handles are decorated with scrolls and the bowl is pierced with roundels to simulate stylised flower heads. This piece is in excellent condition and is very well marked in the bowl and with the sterling mark on each of the side handles. The side of the bowl is also engraved with a contemporary Crest. Samuel Herbert was a specialist pierced worker who made fine strainers and baskets.
